# What We Do

The Pride Center serves as Sacramento State's LGBTQIA2+ Empowerment Center. The Center provides employment, volunteer opportunities, trainings, and gender-inclusive literature for students, staff, faculty, and administrators. The Pride Center works in partnership with all Sac State empowerment centers to celebrate cultural humility and impact that Queer and Trans activists and allies have contribute to the global movement for inclusion.

### Safe Zone Training

Promotes awareness on LGBTQ+ and creates safe spaces/zones on campus for LGBTQ+ students, staff and faculty

- 551 participants attended compared to 350 participants in AY 19-20

    - Add pronouns to signature
    - Use gender-neutral inclusive language
    - Refer colleagues or peer to register for Safe Zone training
    - Follow the Pride Center's social media platform
  - Personal Reflection
    - Reflect on own gender and sexual identity and see how it influence own's life
    - Discover the impact sexuality has on the student experience and how it relates to academic success
