Who We Are:

Working collaboratively with students, faculty, staff, and administrators, Disability Access Center (DAC) provides a wide range of academic accommodations that ensure disabled students have equal educational access. The DAC has a current caseload of 1,261 active students.

**Number of jobs completed is calculated by the total number of editing jobs required to produce accessible formats for students. For instance, a student may provide a textbook that has 12 chapters. If editing is required to make each of the chapters accessible, the book represents 12 editing jobs. If no editing is required, then the book represents one job.*

***During the 2021 – 2022 academic year, there were two blind students who required a significant amount of course materials due to the nature of their majors in which case, the ATL had to create accessible formats of all of the course materials uploaded to the LMS.*
