Who We Are:

Project Rebound assists students to prepare, apply, enroll, and graduate with a degree from Sacramento State. Project Rebound provides educational resources and services for students looking to develop professional skills. We work to transform those who were formerly incarcerated into scholars through counseling, mentoring, academic resources, and career development. We support students who are motivated to succeed by earning a high-quality degree from Sacramento State.

Key Service Objectives

- 1. Fostering a college-going culture among and building recruitment pathways for currently and formerly incarcerated people.
- 2. Helping prospective students prepare, apply, and matriculate.
- 3. Supporting enrolled students to persist and graduate.
- 4. Supporting enrolled students to participate in student life and leadership, community service, and civic engagement.
- 5. Establishing and fostering empowering networks among Project Rebound alumni and students.

Demographics

We serve a diverse student population with over 66 percent of our students being persons of color. Our students have identified as 80 percent male and 20 percent female. We also have a significant proportion of students – 55 percent – who do not qualify for Pell. 40 percent of our students are parents of minor children.

Housing

Project Rebound at Sacramento State has been a leader in housing and juvenile justice initiatives. We currently are housing four students in our men's home and have six students waiting for housing to open. We have two female students and four other males that are in need of housing.
