Who We Are:

The Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) serves California residents from low-income households who demonstrate the motivation and potential to earn a baccalaureate degree at a four-year college. EOP students are individuals who have the potential to succeed at Sacramento State but have not been able to realize their higher education goal because of economic and/or educational background. EOP applicants are California residents and historical low socioeconomic background students.

Program Description

The EOP Summer Transitional Programs offer innovative summer programs that support students' transition to the upcoming academic year. Centered on nurturing a sense of belonging and campus identity, the EOP Transitional Programs provides academic enrichment, community support, and personal growth opportunities. Through close collaboration with other Sacramento State programs and departments, our programs are dedicated to educating, retaining, and graduating students.

Points of Pride

- Summer Bridge Academies added a Senior Bridge program
- The EOP Summer Transitional Programs served nearly 500 underrepresented students
- Summer Bridge programs had over a 90% pass rate on Summer Bridge Courses

Signature Programs:

- Summer Bridge: EOP Summer Bridge Academy served 250 incoming First-Year EOP students. Students were offered up to 5 units of general education which included ENGL 5, EDUC 10, ETHN 11, STAT 1, THEA1, ENGL 1X, HIST 17B. Additionally, students earned a Leadership Certificate through their ALS 79 course. Students attended mandatory workshops that focused on self-care, financial wellness, and campus resources.
 - **Goal 1:** The EOP Summer Bridge Academy will close the achievement gap by providing courses that better equip and prepare students for college-level courses.
 - **Goal 2:** The EOP Summer Bridge Academy will facilitate a positive campus experience through engagement and leadership development.
 - Goal 3: The EOP Summer Bridge Academy will provide comprehensive first-year advising that focuses on utilizing campus resources, understanding the EOP program, and graduation requirements
- **Sophomore Bridge**: Sophomore Bridge **served 112** students and offered 4 sections of ENGL 20 and 1 section of HIST17B. The program is optional for EOP students and open to Sacramento State University students who come from underrepresented backgrounds.
 - **Goal 1:** Re-engage student and provide transition support into their 2nd year
 - **Goal 2:** Gain skills in writing development and leadership training

- **Goal 3:** Provide students personal, academic, and career development opportunities
- Junior Bridge: Junior Bridge served **35 native Juniors** and offered ENGL-109x and ETHN-100.
 - **Goal 1:** The Junior Bridge Program will promote timely graduation by enrolling students in the appropriate course(s) based on their WPJ scores.
 - **Goal 2:** The Junior Bridge Program will facilitate students' commitment and connection to Sacramento State through meaningful interactions with students, instructors, and staff.
- Transfer Bridge: Transfer Bridge Academy served 35 transfer students and offered PSYC 137
 - **Goal 1:** The Transfer Bridge Program will promote timely graduation by enrolling students in the appropriate course(s).
 - **Goal 2:** The Transfer Bridge Program will facilitate students' commitment and connection to Sacramento State through meaningful interactions with students, instructors, and staff.
 - Goal 3: Transfer Bridge Students will effectively utilize academic and counseling support offered through EOP which includes identifying the graduation requirements and identifying other useful resources at the Sacramento State campus.
- Senior Bridge: The Senior Bridge Program served **40 seniors** and offered two asynchronous courses designed to support upper-division that included, PYC 135 AND ETHN 199. Students learned in a diverse multicultural atmosphere, and gained exposure to the vital community, civic engagement opportunities, and professional growth.
 - **Goal 1:** Promote timely graduation by enrolling students in 2 asynchronous Upper Division Courses
 - **Goal 2:** Gain exposure to vital community and civic engagement opportunities
 - **Goal 3:** Give back to EOP and develop personal brand and goals

First-Year Experience

- Our EOP FYE (First Year Experience) program began in the fall semester with 252 incoming students from high school.
- In partnership with Hornet Launch, our EOP students were placed in 15 or more units based on their major selection/field of interest if undeclared.
- All FYE students were part of our EOP ALS 70A course which helped their high school to college transition and provided them with leadership skills through the leadership initiative program.
- Our FYE program collaborated with Student Organizations & Leadership to provide leadership workshops during ALS 70A course to help students complete their gold certificate.
- During their second semester, students were enrolled in an Ethnic Studies 98 course led by our FYE coordinator.
- By the end of the course, students had compiled a career portfolio which included the following: resume, cover letter, 'what can I do with my major' assignment, and an informal mockup interview video.
- Students were provided with a variety of guest presentations including several from the career center on career exploration and major interest.
- Our first-year engagement component included EOP World Sports Day in the fall and in the spring, a Valentines celebration of students enjoying desserts as they wrote valentines cards to each other.

EOP Sophomore Success Program

Program goals

The EOP Sophomore Success Program is designed to aid students as they continue to transition into their second academic year, offering all-encompassing advising, comprehensive career development services, and leadership opportunities.

Points of Pride

- Increased Career Development Opportunities by establishing partnerships with the Career Center & Advising Center
- Bolstered leadership and community service opportunities through the Re-established EOSPA for Fall & Spring
- Provided comprehensive advising through group and one-on-one advising

Events and Activities

- Sophomore Success Workshop: Offered 8 Sophomore Success Workshops in the Fall & Spring semester to provide conversations on sophomore slump, major impaction, summer school information and review important dates and upcoming deadlines regarding registration and financial aid documents. Students are encouraged to set goals and receive guidance towards selecting a major and next semester's classes.
- Career Exploration Workshop: Offered 6 Career Exploration Workshops in the Fall and Spring semester that focused on general education review, impacted major/expressed majors, developing back-up plans, experiential learning, and the career planning process. Students are able to set goals and receive guidance towards selecting a major and next semester's classes.
- **Career Development Workshops in partnership with Career Center:** 2 rounds of 3 Career Cluster Workshops with over 100 students in attendance.
 - Exploration Workshop for Arts, Communication, Community Service, Design, Education, & Government Interest
 - Exploration Workshop for STEM, Health, & Wellness
 - Exploration Workshop for Business, Data & Hospitality

Leadership and Community Events

- Leadership Workshop -Asia Lee is a Sac State Alum, a previous community organizer with Hmong Innovating Politics (HIP) and currently working for the City of Sacramento as the Policy Director for Councilmember Mai Vang, the representative councilmember for District 8 shares her story and encourages students to participate in civic engagement opportunities
- Give Back Events: EOPSA leadership and community service events:
 - Create a Pet Toy! EOPSA members partnered with Circle K International for supplies and learned how to craft pet toys to donate to local animal shelters while waiting for adoption in shelters
 - Brighten a Smile: EOPSA officers organized a Give-Back Event and partnered with Brighten a Smile where they spread holiday cheer through creating and giving cards/notes/letters of encouragement for hospital patients, and retirement home residents
- Creative Engagement I & II Organized health and wellness activities to promote positive mental health. Promoted relaxation by making some stress balls and created mini candles as a practice of aroma therapy. 15 students participated in our first Creative Engagement Day and 10 students participated in our second session.
- Wellness Event Aromatherapy At the EOP Spring Sting event, we had over 80 students participate in our Creative Engagement activities, which included vision boarding, creating stress balls, and making mini take-home candles.

EOP Third Year Success



Program Goals

The EOP Third Year Success program is focused on providing retention support to native juniors entering their third-year and transitional support to incoming transfer students entering their first year at Sacramento State University.

Points of Pride:

- Successfully supported transfer students transition through the Fall Transfer Learning Communities
- Cultivated learning community classes and junior advising to assist students to begin brainstorming and planning toward post-graduation
- Assembled and maintained a strong team of Instructional Student Assistants
- Over 200 students participated in the third-year academic advising campaign covering evaluation of academic progress and preparation for transition toward senior "Grad-Bound" advising

EOP Senior Success

Program Goals

The Senior Success program aims to provide EOP senior students with a full-fledged retention service support to help them persist and prepare to graduate from Sacramento State.

Points of Pride

- Assisting students in monitoring and evaluation of their educational progress towards degree completion.
- Helping students to review their general education and graduation requirements.
- Providing a "Roadmap" of the steps needed to apply for graduation.

• Helping students to make informed choices that will optimize their educational experience and leading them to achieve their educational and career goals.

Signature Programs/Services

- **Grad-Bound Progress Check:** This initiative is one of the senior services to increase the rate of students applying for graduation. The purpose is to help provide fundamental support for EOP seniors to understand their degree progress completion, career or graduate school resources and plan for college exit.
- Senior Success Workshops: is designed to encourage EOP senior students who have applied for graduation guidance in understanding the fundamental tools and information needed to persist and prepare for life after graduation. During the semester, seniors are encouraged to attend our life after graduation workshop on how to prepare for graduation, life after graduation: (resume, cover letter, and job search) and career support services or campus resources.
- **EOP Promotion Celebration** (Spring 2023): Every academic year, the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) at Sacramento State will promote, honor, and celebrate our EOP Class levels from freshmen through seniors. At this event our students will be commemorated with an EOP certificate of achievement and graduating senior students will receive a medallion to wear at Sacramento State Commencement. This event is open to faculty, staff, family, and friends to come and celebrate the achievement with the EOP family.

Points of Pride

- Inclusion and increased engagement have become a focal point of our department, and increased students are taking advantage of the opportunities to reconnect with our office
- The number of students applying for graduation in a timely manner has increased exponentially
- We have worked with decreasing the number of students needing academic recovery with a decrease in the number of students on academic probation or disqualification.
- We have an increase in the number of students completing their advising

Data Outcomes

- We had 2,328 advising sessions completed through the EAB with academic progress made with students.
- 526 students attended advising those who are juniors, which is a significant impact. It has been difficult to get the juniors into advising. These numbers show an increased participation rate
- 97.79% of our seniors have applied for graduation for that academic year
