Who We Are:

The <u>Faculty Student Mentor Program (FSMP)</u> is one of several educational equity programs designed to provide students with the academic support and encouragement needed to accomplish their educational goals. In collaboration with teams of faculty and peer mentors from the respective Colleges, the program is designed to offer academic, career, and personal support to students from traditionally low-income communities who identified as first generation and/or as a student of color.

Points of Pride

• Reconvened to reimagined the opportunities for FSMP to increase campus knowledge and share individual department's best practices to meet students where they are.



- Monthly meeting to discuss student data (dashboard and self-reported) which informs and intentionally includes Pell-eligible students in programmatic decisions on resources and engagement opportunities (workshops, meet and greet, advising etc.).
- Co-collaborated awards ceremony with each college and campus equity programs to honor 35 Pell eligible students who has met and demonstrated commitment to academic excellence.

Data Outcomes

- 100% of faculty and staff participants agreed to the assessment template for Fall 2023 and beyond.
- Finalized program mission and goals for the academic year and beyond.
- Convened consistent monthly meetings and participation by each college.

Signature Programs

- Each college offered individuals programs and services that were supplemented by FSMP success workshops.
- Annual awards luncheon to honor faculty and staff impact on Pell-eligible students.

Events and Activities

- College of SSIS Department Chair, Faculty Fellows, Faculty Advisors, SSC Advisors conducted 4,300 student connections.
- Over 11,000 students were emailed at least twice by their college faculty mentor.
- College of NSM offered study skills workshops, with a total of 132 students with support from 14 FSMP peer mentors.
