Who We Are:

Partnerships to Advance the Value of Education (PAVE) is a K-12 academic tutoring and college mentoring program. Devoted to improve the educational opportunities for K-12 scholars and help them achieve college, career, and life success, the PAVE program works collaboratively with over 6 regional K-12 school districts to engage Sacramento State students as academic tutors and college role models to provide subject matter support in English Language Arts/Literacy and Mathematics and/or the Sciences.

Points of Pride

- PAVE serves as a global partner with off campus K-12 school districts to provide mentoring/tutoring and support the teacher preparation pipeline to diversify the teaching profession.
- PAVE is accredited by the National Tutoring Association and was awarded the 2023 American College Personnel Association (ACPA) Collaborative Excellence award.
- PAVE is a semester program with a structured and streamlined recruitment, training and monitoring process.

Data Outcomes

- 100% of tutors expressed interest in a potential career in education (teaching, counseling, administration, etc.)
- 80% of tutors attended an informational session and learned knowledge about admissions requirements for teaching credential program.
- 80% of K-12 student interaction with a tutor increased awareness about college and career pathway and program opportunities.

Signature Programs:

• Recruitment (10 sessions), training (12 sessions) and school assignment occurs each semester.



Events and Activities:

- On average recruitment has over 200 students and training has over 100 student attendees.
- On average, over 30 tutors commit to serve as a tutor in three to six school sites.

- Received Program of the Year by National Tutoring Association.

Data Outcomes

- 92% of tutors agreed that being involved in this program helped them obtain a positive experience both as a student and as a tutor.
- 75% of tutors agreed that being involved in this program helped them make a satisfying impact with academic progress made with students.
- Top three skills gained from serving as a tutor: Professionalism/Work Ethic (89%), Critical Thinking/Problem Solving, (88%), and Global and Intercultural Fluency (82%).
