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Executive Summary

Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) at California State University, Sacramento is a 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation and the recognized student body auxiliary organization at Sacramento State. Auxiliary organizations exist because the state recognized the need for certain activities at the campuses and the CSU, but determined that these activities would be best performed by one or more nonprofit organizations having a legally separate relationship with their respective campus or the CSU.

The Associated Students provides support to a variety of programs aimed at meeting the needs of the students of the University. The Association also serves as a vehicle for participation in the governance of the University. The Associated Students may serve, as an auxiliary organization, as the fiscal agent for deposit accounts for student organizations and student-related programs and activities.

This academic year, ASI provided Sac State students with experiential education through their student employment opportunities. Two hundred and twenty-six students were employed in ASI departments during the fall, and 247 students were employed during spring.

The ASI Food Pantry provided food and basic necessities to Sacramento State students with financial hardships or food insecurity. During the academic year, 1043 unduplicated students accessed the food pantry with more than 4,500 total visits.

ASI also provided \$323,000 to 36 student support programs through the ASI External grant. Twenty-seven of the 36 awarded grants were allocated to various student support centers that foster diversity and inclusion. Some of these groups included: College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP), Dreamer Resource Center, Learning Communities, Male Empowerment Collaborative, and more.

Mission

Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) serves as the official governing body of Sacramento State students and meets the varied needs of students through operation and sponsorship of programs and services. ASI provides experiential education, leadership opportunities, student representation, various business and recreational services, and campus life programs and activities which support the campus and greater Sacramento community.

Through operation and sponsorship of programs and services designed to effectively meet the varied needs and demands of a diverse student body;

This academic year, the Vice President of the Division of Student Affairs decided to align department goals with the university's goals, Student Affairs Divisional Goals, and Baccalaureate Learning Outcomes. Associated Students is dedicated to providing experiential education opportunities for Sacramento State students by: providing mentorship, fostering career growth, and aiding retention until graduation. ASI employed 226 students during the fall and 247 during the spring in their ASI Aquatics Center, ASI Business Office, ASI Children's Center, ASI Peak Adventures, ASI Government Office, and ASI Student Engagement and Outreach.

Department Goal 2: Associated Students will track the students' use of the ASI Food Pantry and the ASI Pop-Up Pantry.

Standard of achievement: Associated Students will carefully track any increase in demand to address needs for increased funding and fundraising, and additional programming to address food insecurity on campus.

The ASI Food Pantry exists to provide food and basic necessities to Sac State students with financial hardships or food insecurity, at no cost. In addition to helping alleviate hunger within the student community, the ASI Food Pantry aims to decrease the impact that food insecurities have on the academic success of students.

The ASI Food Pantry provides food and toiletries for Sac State students with financial hardships who show a valid student OneCard. Students are allowed to come once a week.

During the academic year, 1,043 unduplicated students accessed the food pantry. There were 2043 visits during the fall, 24 visits during the winter break, 2557 visits during spring, and 44 visits during the summer. Figure 1 shows the monthly breakdown.

The Associated Students is committed to creating an active and engaged campus community at Sacramento State. The goal of fostering campus life can only be met through the combined efforts of various programs and organizations throughout campus. Each fiscal year, ASI allocates funds, which are to be disbursed to those on-campus programs that are dedicated to a common goal of serving the students. The 2017-2018 ASI Board of Directors approved the 2018-2019 budget and allocated \$323,000 in external funding for 36 programs. Of the 36 programs funded, \$269,000 were allocated for 27 programs that foster diversity and inclusion. These 27 programs were:
