

Other Indicators

- 85% of high unit DEGREES seniors applied for graduation while 79% of high unit Non-DEGREES seniors applied for graduation.
- **45%** of second year DEGREES students were enrolled in 15 units or more for spring 2019 while **43%** of second year Non-DEGREES students were enrolled in 15 units or more for spring 2019.
- **24%** of DEGREES students with 60 units or more registered for WPJ while **27%** of Non-DEGREES students with 60 units or more registered for WPJ.
