

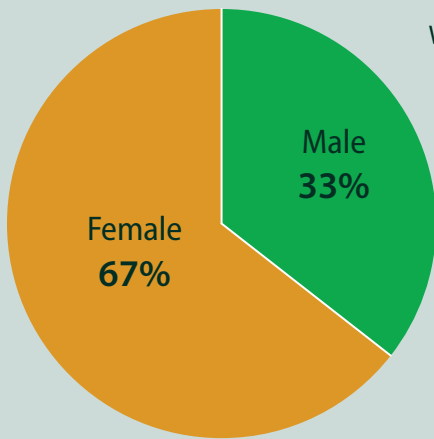

Who we are

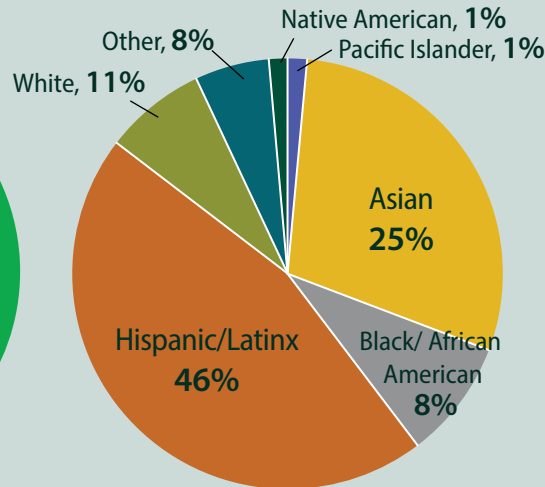
The Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) serves California residents from low-income households who demonstrate the motivation and potential to earn a baccalaureate degree.

Demographics of Students

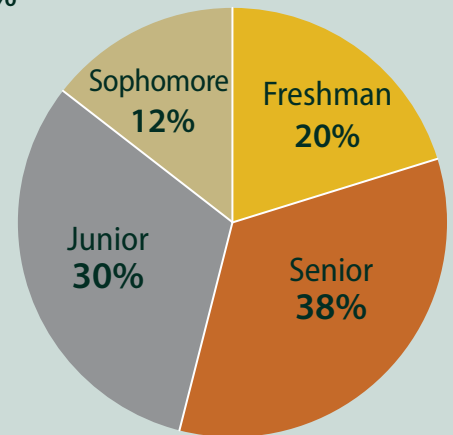

EOP Components

Admission/Outreach

- **31 different** on and off-campus events including Los Rios Transfer Days, Feria de Educacion, High School EOP presentations and application workshops.
- **2097** total number of students who attended.
- First-time freshmen
 - **679 freshmen** were admitted by March 17, 2019
 - **346 freshmen** completed their ITE for Admission & EOP
 - **220 freshmen** enrolled during fall 2019
- Transfer
 - **484 transfer** students were admitted by March 17, 2019
 - **226 transfer** completed their ITE for Admission & EOP
 - **166 transfer** enrolled during fall 2019



Bridge Programs

- **Summer Bridge** students earn up to five college units before beginning their first semester. This program familiarizes students with Sacramento State's resources, services, and campus.
- **Transfer Bridge** helps students transition from community college to Sacramento State. Eligible underrepresented minority transfer students can fulfill the writing-intensive graduation requirement by taking a writing intensive course over the summer for free.
- **Sophomore Bridge** provides a required sophomore-level composition class during the summer.



Learning Community

- EOP Learning Community is a small group of students and faculty who all work and learn together in a collegial atmosphere.
 - **Freshman Learning Community** - students typically register for a set of 3-4 courses – two General Education courses and a Learning Strategies course (ALS 70A).
 - **Transfer Learning Community** – a total of 174 transfer learning students took an ETHN 198 course; 97% of them received credit.

Retention

- **Undeclared/Expressed Interest** – guides students to complete prerequisite courses and timely declaration of major before earning 60 units.
- **Academic Recovery Program** – helps students get their academic career back on track after being on academic probation, academically disqualified, or suspended.
- **Graduation Bound** – provides fundamental support for EOP seniors to understand their degree progress completion, career or graduate school resources and plan after college.
- **Alumni Mentor Program** – matches EOP alumni with current EOP students on a monthly basis. Designed to provide current students with networking, resources, and career support.
- **Advising** - per class level.
- **Career Services** - including career exploration.
