- Feria de Educación 2019 empowers Spanish-speaking parents and students by providing them with information and resources to help them succeed in California's educational system.
 - Goals
 - i. Provide a culturally sensitive environment for Spanish-speaking parents with children of all ages
 - ii. Bridge the cultural gap between Spanish-speaking parents and California's educational system
 - iii. Provide information and resources (in Spanish and English) from pre-school to higher education aimed at increasing the college-going culture among the Latinx population
 - iv. Provide a variety of career paths and alternatives in a diverse range of fields
 - Around 7,200 students and parents attended the event
 - 11 interactive workshops and various tracks
 - i. Road Map to the Community College System
 - ii. Road Map to the California State University System
 - iii. Road Map to the University of California System
 - iv. Ready to Apply! College Admissions and Financial Aid Workshop
 - v. The Role of Parents in Their Children's Education

 - 82% of attendees heard about the event through his/her school
 - 57% of attendees agreed that the educational pathway was the most significant activity at the event, followed by workshops at 8%
