## What We Do

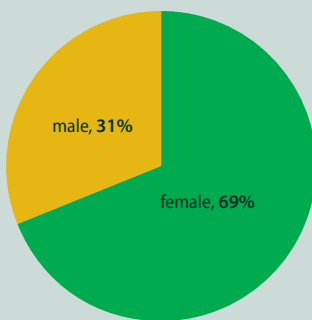
*The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) is a federally funded program designed to serve students from a migrant and seasonal farm working background succeed at Sacramento State.*

## Demographics of Students

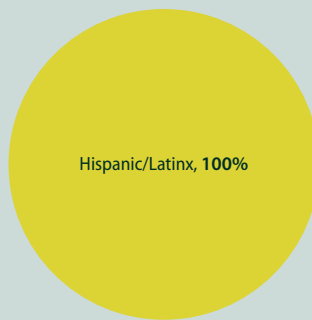

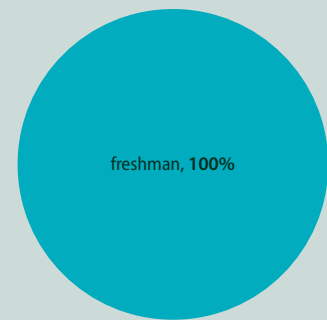

**100%** of students persisted the following semester.



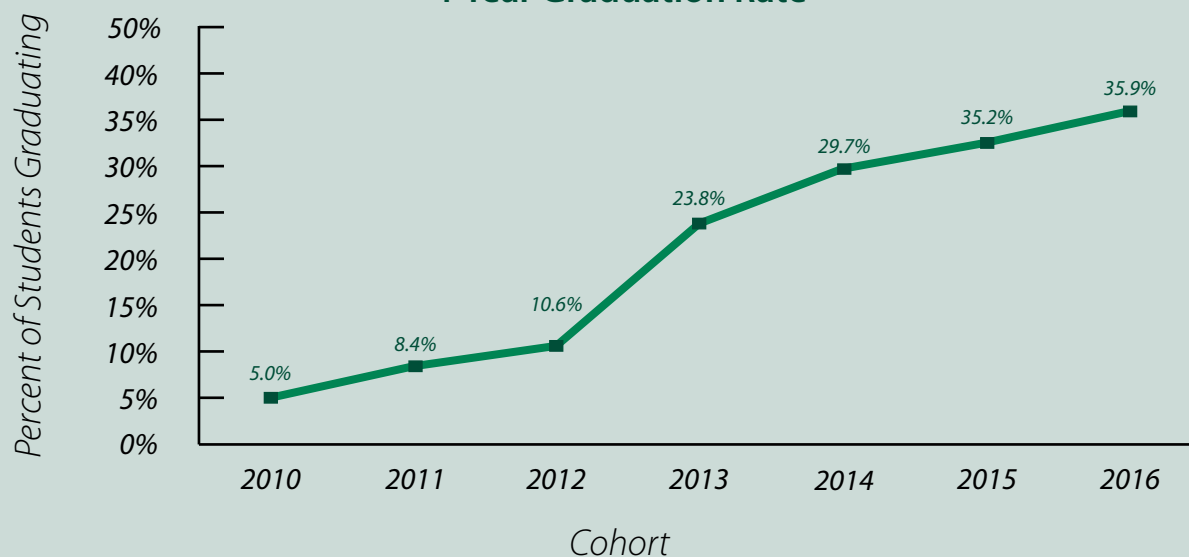
