

Survey Results

97% of trainees identified at least two resources to support undocumented students **96%** of trainees reported feeling more prepared to support undocumented students.

Dream Connections


11 facilitated connections: 147 attendees during Fall 2019 **11** facilitated connections: 96 attendees during Spring 2020
