





TRANSITIONING TO A RESIDENTIAL LIVE-ON REQUIREMENT

TIMELINE

Starting in Fall 2026, the campus will implement the first phase of Sacramento State's Residential Live-On Requirement Policy for incoming students to support student success, community engagement, and academic achievement.

WHAT'S CHANGING?

FALL 2026

All incoming first-year students (non-transfer students) will be required to live in university housing located in North Village Residential Community during their first academic year.

*North Village First-Year Halls: Riverview, Desmond, Jenkins, Draper, Sierra, Klamath, & Mt. Whitney

FALL 2027

All incoming first-year students (non-transfer students) will be required to live in university housing during their first two academic years.

LIVE, LEARN, SUCCEED.

By living on campus, students gain more than a place to live; they gain a supportive community designed to help them thrive. This policy aligns with system-wide graduation initiatives and ensures Sacramento State students have the tools, resources, and networks they need for success.

BENEFITS

Research consistently shows that students who live on campus:

- 1. Have higher GPAs & stronger academic outcomes.
- 2. Are more likely to return for their second year & graduate on time.
- 3. Have convenient access to campus academic resources & student support services.
- 4. Develop a greater sense of belonging & participation in student life.
- 5. Benefit from a safe & supportive community with 24/7 staff & structured programs.

New Residence Halls & Occupancy Changes

Mt. Whitney Hall - Opening Fall 2026

Brand-new residence hall designed exclusively for first-year students. 335 beds within a modern, supportive community.

Riverview Hall

Transitioning to First-Year Use Only.

Adding more than 160 first-year beds to foster a building-wide shared experience.

Redesigned Residential Curriculum

- Promote student growth through intentional programming tailored to the first-year and second-year experience. Focused on belonging, wellness, academic success, and life skills.
- Collaborations with campus partners to integrate further academic and wellness initiatives into the residential experience.

Enhanced Student Engagement & Social Integration

- Increased Student-Led Programming: More social, inclusive, and late-night/weekend programs.
- Traditions: "Hornet First Night" and other large-scale campus program opportunities.

EXEMPTIONS

Sacramento State understands that some students may have unique circumstances. Students may apply for an exemption under specific conditions from the live-on requirement for reasons including, but not limited to:

Local Residency

Living with immediate family (parent/legal quardian, spouse, grandparent, aunt/uncle) within:

- **50 miles or less** of Sacramento State (Academic Year 2026-2027)
- 30 miles or less of Sacramento State (Academic Year 2027-2028)
- Age
 - Student is 20 years old or older by the first day of classes.
- Independent Student Status
 - Student is considered independent on the FAFSA.
- Military or Veteran Status
 - Student is an active-duty service member or U.S. veteran.
- Finacial Hardship Consideration
 - Demonstrated and verified financial hardship.
- Live-In Employment
 - Student is required to live at their job site as a care provider.
- Study Abroad or Away/Academic Internship
 - Internship or study program requiring a student to reside outside of Sacramento County.
- Medical or Disability Considerations
 - Student has a documented condition that cannot be accommodated in campus housing.
- Other Special Circumstances
 - Reviewed individually
